

OGP Global Summit Agenda

July 17-19, 2018 Tbilisi, Georgia

This draft agenda for the Global Summit was co-created with the community through an open call for proposals. The proposals were then evaluated by an editorial committee using the following criteria: relevance to overall thematic track, across regions, and to OGP's mandate; creativity through format and encouraging participation; impact; and inclusivity across sectors, regions, and communities. The editorial committee consisted of representatives from the OGP Support Unit, the Government of Georgia, civil society organizations, and international partners. We received over five hundred proposals in less than a month covering the three main tracks - anti-corruption, civic engagement, public service delivery, and an open track showcasing other cross-cutting and emerging issues. A more detailed agenda with session descriptions and speakers will be released in mid-June.

Notes on the Draft Agenda for the 2018 OGP Global Summit

- The agenda was drafted by an editorial committee - comprising members of the OGP Support Unit, the Government of Georgia, civil society colleagues from Georgia, international partners.
- This draft agenda draws from the 500+ proposals that OGP received from its diverse community comprising governments, civil society, academics, private sector, international organizations, journalists, and other open government reformers from across the world. To ensure the agenda covers the breadth of themes relevant to OGP's global community, the editorial committee recommended merging selected proposals that focused on similar or intersecting topics.
- This draft agenda is subject to change based on the availability of session organizers and speakers. A more detailed agenda with session descriptions, speaker, and assigned dates/times will be released by mid-June.
- If you submitted a session proposal, the Summit organizers will contact you over the next two weeks. Please contact us only if you have not received a notification for your session proposal by May 31, 2018.
- At this stage, the editorial committee has just considered the sessions proposals - not the submissions for individual speakers. From here on out, the editorial committee will work with all session organizers to bring in a diverse mix of speakers - to ensure gender, regional, and cross-sectoral representation throughout the agenda.
- The sessions titled "*Raising Thematic Ambition: Spotlight on Reformers and Tools*" seeks to highlight some of the best stories from across OGP and open government reformers through creative presentation formats. A detailed list of those speakers, selected from the proposals received, will be shared as soon as possible.
- Session proposals on parliamentary engagement may still be considered for the July 17 meetings focused on parliaments. The editorial committee designing the parliament agenda for that day, led by representatives from the Parliament of Georgia and other partners, may be in touch with those who submitted relevant proposals directly about possibilities for integration into that agenda.
